Despite banging in the goals, Rahull still believes he and his teammates have room for improvement.

"We need to convert more of our penalty corners and chances from open play, especially during the games against the big teams," said Rahull.

"We only get a few opportunities and if we don't take them, it will end up costing us the game.

"Our preparations have been going well so far. We had three training sessions to work on some of our mistakes from previous matches."
