## Four players called up for national duty

PETALING JAYA: The national hockey team will see four new faces in the squad.

Akhimullah Anuar Esook, Arif Syafie Ishak, Noor Firdaus Rosdi and Azrai Aizad Abu Kamal were called up for a special training camp to prepare for the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup in Ipoh and FIH Men's Final Series in Kuala Lumpur.

Both tournaments will be held from March 23-30 and April 26-May 4 respectively. National head coach Roelant Oltmans, who was

seen scouting during the Malaysian Hockey League (MHL), has identified 28 players for the camp, which will be held in Kuantan from March 10-16.

In last year's edition of the tournament, Malaysia finished fourth after they were beaten by Argentina 3-1 in the third-fourth placing match.
