Ministry to ensure power producers pay RM198m debt

THE contribution arrears owed to the Electricity Supplies Industry Trust Account (AAIBE) by inde-pendent power producers (IPPs) has increased to RM197.9 million, the Dewan Rakyat was told yes-terday.

Environment, and Climate
Change Minister Yeo Bee Yin said
the arrears were for the period
between 2008 and last year.
She said no IPPs would be
spared from making payment of

the outstanding contribution to AAIBE.

"To ensure IPPs meet the li-censing requirement and con-tribute to AAIBE and Sabah AAIBE, the ministry, through the Energy Commission, has taken action to ensure that contribu-tions for the financial year end-ing 2018 will be collected before

ing 2018 will be collected before Dec 31.

"The commission is also collecting arrears from 2008 to last year. For any IPP that is unable to make a one-off payment, negotiations are underway to allow the payment to be made via instalments, bence to clear the extended."

the payment to be made via instalments, hence to clear the existing arrears," she said in her reply during question time at the Parliament here yesterday.

Yeo was replying to Chan Foong Hin (Pakatan Harapan-Kota Kinabalu), who asked about the status of AAIBE and how the money raised was used to develop the electricity industry, especially in

raised was used to develop the electricity industry, especially in renewable energy.

Yeo said to date the ministry managed to secure IPPs' commitment to pay RM100.7 million in arrears to AAIBE and RM4.8 million to Sabah AAIBE in instalments before Dec 31 next year.

On the use of AAIBE funds, Yeo said it was subject to surat ikatan amanah (trust deed), which involves research and development, as well as training and education.

"The use of these funds was based on a programme that pro-motes the use of electricity ef-ficiency, development and pro-motion of the electricity supply industry, as well as electricity tar-iff impact."
