Birch Birch. Birch, who had been sent to take up the position of the first British Resident in Perak, was assassinated as the result of a conspiracy involving the local chiefs Maharaja Lela and Sepuntum. The British respond-ed with a military intervention

Sepuntum. The British respond-ed with a military intervention during the Perak War. Ramli's political journey began in 1978 when he was elected Kampung Gajah assemblyman and then appointed a state exec-utive councillor. After his tenure in the state administration, he went on to the federal level when he was elected as Pasir Salak MP in 2004. He was Deputy Minister of

"It is to look beyond hospitals and medicine, and to create spaces where age is embraced, not endured. He said Penang's strength lay in its unity between the old and yooung, between heritage and progress and between tradition and technology, as balance is everything.

Born on March 16, 1941, in Pasir Salak, Perak, Ramli demon-strated his leadership creden-tials as the eighth Perak Mentri Besar, a position he held for 17 years from 1982 to 1999, making him the longest-serving chief executive of the state.

He was Deputy Minister of Transport from 2000 to 2004 and Dewan Rakyat speaker from 2004 to 2008.

In his first term in Parliament,

In his first term in Parliament, he was entrusted to chair the Public Accounts Committee (PAC), a key parliamentary over-sight body. On April 24, 2025, Ramli was appointed the ninth Yang di-Pertua Negri of Penang. He received the instrument of appointment from His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim, King of Malaysia, during a presentation

Malaysia, during a presentation ceremony at Istana Negara. At the ceremony, he was also conferred the Seri Maharaja

conferred the Seri Maharaja Mangku Negara (SMN) award which carries the title Tun. Ramli's appointment was made in accordance with Article 1 of the Penang Constitution for a term of four years, until April 30, 2029. He was sworn in at Dewan Sri Pinang in Penang on May 1. His leadership within Umno

was equally significant, having chaired the Perak Umno liaison committee for 16 years (1984 to 2000) and being member of the party supreme council from 1980 to 2006.

1980 to 2006. He received his early educa-tion from Sekolah Melayu Pasir Salak, Saint Anthony's School and Anglo-Chinese School, both in Teluk Intan, and his tertiary education at the elite Malay College Kuala Kangsar. Ramli read law at Queen's University. Belfast, before being admitted as barrister at Lincoln's Inn, London. During his time in the United

During his time in the United Kingdom, he was active in the students' union in Belfast and students' union in Belfast and became political secretary and editor of the Kesatuan Melayu United Kingdom magazine. Upon his return to Malaysia, Ramli embarked on an academic career, becoming a law lecturer at the Mara Institute of Technology (now known as Universiti Teknologi Mara, or Universiti Teknologi Mara, or UITM). He also served as a part-time lecturer at the University of Malaya in the early 1970s.

Malaya in the early 1970s. In 1971, he made history as the first in-house legal adviser to the National Electricity Board or NEB (now known as Tenaga Nasional Bhd or TNB).

Nasional Bhd or TNB). Demonstrating his entrepre-neurial spirit and legal acumen, he went on to qualify as an advocate and solicitor of the High Court of Malaya and co-founded the law firm Kadir, Tan & Ramli in 1977.

Notable contributions

His political career aside, Ramli has also authored several books as well as written articles for the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association mag-azine and Pasir Salak Historical Complex.

azine and Pasir Saiak Fusion and Complex. While still serving as Perak Mentri Besar, he penned the book Pasir Salak: Schamparan Sejarah Perjuangan, which was about the Malay rebellion that

took place on Nov 2, 1875, against British rule in Perak. At the end of 2010, he completed *Meniti Zaman* which described the beautiful and sim-ple but yet challenging rural existence during and after the Iapanese occupation.

Japanese occupation. His next book, Tuan Yang

Japanese occupation. His next book, *Tuan Yang* di-Pertua: Daripada Seorang Budak Kampung Sehingga Menjadi Peneraju Parlimen, laid out in vivid details the proceed-ings in Parliament in a manner not done before. His literary prowess was not limited to writing books as he has also produced various pam-phets and booklets on tourism for Pasir Salak and Perak. Realising the importance of educating Malaysians on their history, Ramli commissioned the Pasir Salak Historical Complex, consisting of 42 dioramas done in wood depicting all the impor-tant events in the history of Malaysia and the Malays in the early 1990s. He is also responsible for the setting up of the first UITM branch campus in Perak, the construction of Proton City in tanjung Malim, the Lumut Port and the development of Meru Raya in Ipoh. His other notable contribu-

Raya in Ipoh. His other notable contribu-

tions include the establishment of Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) and Universiti Pendidikan of Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) and Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI), the develop-ment of rural centres and the promotion of industrial pockets. His most cherished recogni-tion was however for his efforts in the eradication of hardcore poverty in Perak in 1996. In his younger days, his busy schedule and commitments did not prevent him from pursuing his love for sports such as bad-minton, football and polo. He also enjoys trekking and has trekked in Norway, Bhutan and Nepal, and has scaled Gunung Tahan - the highest mountain in Peninsular Malaysia. The President of the Perak Aero Club since 2007, Ramli also has a pilot licence and likes flying ultra-light planes and small aircraft. His achievements have not gone unnoticed. He was award

His achievements have not gone unnoticed. He was award-ed the title Datuk Seri Maharaja

ed the title Datuk Seri Maharaja Lela Mangkubumi by a panel of Acheh's customary chiefs for promoting good relations between Acheh and Perak. He is also a permanent mem-ber of the Perak Privy Council and holds the title, Orang Kaya-Kaya Seri Agar Diraja (Datuk Sagor), which he inherited from his great great grandfather. In 1996, Ramli was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Laws by the University of Sheffield, United Kingdom for promoting closer relations between Perak and the institution through the

closer relations between Perak and the institution through the joint establishment of the Perak Medical College in Ipoh. He was also appointed as the Pro-Chancellor of Universiti Malaya in 2014. He is married to Toh Puan Raja Noora Ashikin Raja Abdullah. The happy couple is blessed with four children.
