ELECTRICITY SUPPLY AGREEMENT

BDC strengthens collaboration with TNB for data centre campus

KUALA LUMPUR: Bridge Data Centres International Pte Ltd (BDC) has reinforced its collaboration with Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB) through the signing of an electricity supply agreement (ESA) for its data centre in Malaysia.

The ESA, inked on March 7, signifies TNB's commitment to furnish additional power resources to facilitate BDC's data centre expansion in Johor.

BDC's alliance with TNB commenced in 2022 when it received 275 kilovolts of utility power from TNB to support its inaugural hyperscale data centre.

Two years on, BDC is developing another data centre campus, emphasising lower power usage effectiveness standards in the region.

Construction of the facility was progressing according to schedule, with the first phase of the core and shell building nearing completion, it said in a statement.

BDC, a key player in the Asia Pacific data centre market, said it anticipated achieving the certificate of completion and compliance, a mandatory statutory requirement in its early phases.

BDC president Eric Fan said throughout its journey to advance digital connectivity, TNB and various government agencies had provided unwavering support to BDC.

BDC is a subsidiary of Chindata Group, a carrier-neutral hyperscale data centre solution provider in global emerging markets.
