# TNB provides 60 generator sets worth RM715,000

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB) has begun distributing aid to flood victims in Johor, Pahang and Terengganu that included 60 sets of power generators worth RM715,000.

TNB said it had begun channelling assistance to victims at evacuation centres as part of its corporate social responsibility.

"We have provided over 60 sets of generators to temporary evacuation centres as well as basic necessities to fulfil the daily needs of the flood victims," it said in a statement yesterday.

Some 36 generators were set up in Pahang while another 27 were provided in Terengganu for 10,469 flood victims affected by electricity supply cuts.

As of 11am yesterday, a total of 244 TNB substations in both states were rendered unoperable due to the floods.

TNB said the basic necessities were handed over to selected areas, including Kampung Paya Merah, Labis and Sek Keb Bandar Mersing, the Royal Malaysian Air Force base in Kuantan, Kemaman and Hulu Terengganu district offic-

es. In **KUANTAN**, Pahang Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Adnan Yaakob expressed his sadness over the situation after visiting one of the worst hit areas at Perkampungan Sungai Isap.

"I am sad, the Government is sad. However, what can we do? It happened so fast, and it was a disaster to all of us," Adnan said after he visited the flood relief centre in Wisma Belia at Indera Mahkota here yesterday.

The eight districts affected were Jerantut, Bera, Lipis, Temerloh, Rompin, Pekan,

Maran, and Kuantan, involving some 40,000 victims.

Adnan admitted that there were weaknesses from the government in helping the villagers out

on the first day of the disaster, though he added it was pointless to keep on pointing fingers as to who should be responsible.

"As the floods worsened, everybody was shocked, not only the victims but also all of us who were not affected."
