ABIS 2025: Shaping Asean's next phase amid global uncertainty

he Asean Business and Investment Summit (ABIS) 2025 will convene in Kuala Lumpur on Oct 25 and 26, bringing together government leaders and decision-makers from the private sector to discuss the key issues shaping Asean's economic and strategic outlook.

The goal is to strengthen the region's position as a re-silient, fast-growing and forward-looking economic bloc. Hosted by the Asean Business Advisory Council (Ase-an-BAC) Malaysia, the summit comes at a time when the region faces growing complexity — from economic frag-mentation and climate volatility to digital disruption and widening inequality. These challenges call for not only national resilience but also stronger regional coherence.

With a combined gross domestic product (GDP) nearing US\$4 trillion in 2024, Asean stands as the world's fifth-larg-est economy and is projected to rise to fourth place by 2030.

Asean-BAC chairman Tan Sri Nazir Razak describes the summit as timely, urging Asean to use this moment to strengthen unity, create shared economic value and en-hance its strategic influence on the global stage.

"ABIS 2025 comes at a critical and opportune time. The world is shifting fast — this is the moment for Asean and its dialogue partners to prove that when we collaborate

its dialogue partners to prove that when we collaborate and stand together, we can not only create economic value but also shape a more resilient and influential Asean in the emerging world order," he says.

The two-day summit will be held at the Malaysia International Trade and Exhibition Centre (Mitec).

Under the theme "Unifying Markets for Shared Prosperity", ABIS 2025 will focus on advancing regional integration through initiatives such as the Asean Business Entity, enhanced intra-Asean capital flows and greater facilitation of cross-border movement of people and goods. The summit will also examine how Asean can deepen

business-to-business collaboration, foster a stronger regional identity and promote greater inclusion by supporting micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), equal opportunities and workforce development.

It will further address regulatory challenges and spark a regional conversation on harnessing artificial intelligence (AI) to drive Asean's growth.

Among the key highlights of ABIS 2025 are the unveiling of the 10th e-Conomy SEA report by Google, Temasek and Bain & Company, as well as the Leadership Dialogue held in conjunction with the launch of Google AI for the Planet. In addition, the summit will see the launch of the Green Finance Pillar (Pillar II) of the Asean-UK Green Transition Fund, while the Asean-Japan Centre (AJC) will host a panel discussion titled "Driving Inclusive Futures in Asean and Japan: Women's Entrepreneurship in a Digital World".

More than 1,500 delegates are expected to attend the summit, including heads of government, industry leaders, entrepreneurs and investors.



to honour leading enterprises and individuals contributing to the region's progress. Now in its 18th edition, the awards recognise excel-

Meanwhile, the Economic Research Institute for Asean and East Asia (ERIA) will present the One Asean Startup Award recognising groundbreaking startups that embody Asean's spirit of collaboration and pro-gress, with two award categories — Zero Emission and Artificial Intelligence.
