Solar power rebates via SuRIA Home launched

PUTRAJAYA: The government has introduced solar rebates under the Sustainable Rebate and Incentive Assistance (SuRIA) Home programme to ease the people's burden amid the global supply crisis.

Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof said consumers who install the Enhanced Solar Energy Transition Programme (Solar ATAP) system and meet eligibility criteria could receive a rebate of RM600 per 1kWac

of solar installation, up to a maximum of RM3,000, or 5kWac.

SuRIA Home is an incentive for those installing solar panels under the Solar ATAP programme, which was rolled out in January.

"Following enquiries on incentives, we have decided to allocate RM120 million for it from June 1 until December," said Fadillah, who is also energy transition and water transformation minister, after officiating at the initiative at

the ministry here yesterday.

He said the programme was expected to benefit 45,000 to 50,000 households with an accumulated solar capacity of about 250MW, expanding residential rooftop solar usage nationwide.

The SuRIA Home programme is open for solar installations under Solar ATAP until Dec 31 or until the 250MW quota is reached.

The rebate will begin on June 1, on a first-come, first-served basis.
