HIGHLANDER Hockey Club are looking at the TNB-QNET Selangor Hockey League to expose their players to high-level competitive matches.

Highlander HC, playing in Division Three of the league, went down 1-4 to KIE Hockey Team in a Group A match at the Pandamaran Hockey Stadium in Klang.

Highlander HC team manger K. Nithiyananthan said they were not too concerned with the results as their team comprised a group of Under-17 players.
