TENAGA Nasional Bhd (TNB) Kepong branch has donated RM5,400 to PPR Pekan Kepong residents in the B40 group to help them in this movement control order (MCO) period.

Kepong Community Service Centre head Yee Poh Ping said the timely aid had lessened the burden of the residents as some had lost their jobs during this period.

"It definitely helps the people go through these hard times a little bit easier, especially nearing Hari Raya Aidilfitri.

"The money was used to buy groceries as well as ingredients for volunteers at the flats to cook for the residents.

"The food and supplies were distributed among three blocks of

residents living in about 950 units," he said during a press conference at the flats.

Volunteers were seen cooking the meals for 300 units in Block A where each unit received three packets of rice, chicken, cabbage, papadom and apples to break fast.

The remaining funds were used to buy bags of rice and groceries that were distributed to the residents of the other two blocks.

PPR Pekan Kepong Residents Association chairman Kamarul Ariffin Masson thanked TNB for their charitable initiatives.

"We asked the leader of the block to distribute the meals to prevent residents overcrowding the lobby," he said.
