



MN HOLDINGS BAGS RM137.8M TNB JOB

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Contract involves works at gas-insulated substation in Terengganu

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MN Holdings Bhd has secured a RM137.8 million contract from Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB) for a transmission main intake project in Terengganu.

The company said this is the largest direct contract it has received from TNB, further reinforcing its role in supporting Malaysia's national grid infrastructure.

The project involves the construction of a new 275-kilovolt transmission main intake at the Kenyir switching station, a gas-

insulated substation in Terengganu.

MN Holdings will be responsible for the supply, installation and commissioning of the transmission main intake including primary, secondary and associated civil works.

The project will span 730 days, with completion expected by March 2027.

MN Holdings executive director Datuk Dang Siong Diang said the project reflects TNB's trust in its ability to deliver high-quality

solutions that meet stringent technical and operational standards.

"With Peninsular Malaysia's power reserve margin projected to remain healthy at 28 to 36 per cent and electricity demand set to grow by 2.9 per cent annually, driven by economic expansion and the rise of data centres, we see strong prospects for grid and infrastructure upgrades.

"Combined with initiatives such as the large-scale solar programme, the new enhanced

despatch arrangement and the green electricity tariff 2025, offering up to 6,600 gigawatt hours of renewable energy for subscription.

"These developments present clear opportunities for MN Holdings to support Malaysia's accelerating shift towards a low-carbon and sustainable energy future," he said in a statement yesterday.

MN Holdings said the contract brings its order book to RM977.8 million.
