Klang Valley experi-enced gains in their English literacy. Nehemiah said he

was truly humbled, honoured and thankful to God for the recognition. "I felt incredibly minilored to encour privileged to repre-sent the nation," he said in a Uniten press release, add-ing that the Diana

Award is an inde-pendent acknowl-edgment of one's capacity to

dive genuine change. Han advocates for environ-mental justice and environmen-tal defenders' rights in South-East Asia, with YUFE mobilising Malaysians nationwide for

environmental action through

environmental action through storytelling, grassroots projects, and policy advocacy. He has also launched Malaysia's largest sustainability mentorship programme that connects undergraduates with environmental leaders globally, resulting in internships, jobs, and eco startups, having led over 70 youths in spearheading campaigns that have reached

over 70 youths in spearheading campaigns that have reached 30,000 Malaysians. A total of 189 youths from 31 countries around the world were honoured in a virtual award cer-emony on June 30, a day before Diana's birthday on July 1. To be eligible for The Diana Award, nominees must be aged between nine and 25, and have been carrying out their activities

been carrying out their activities for a minimum of 12 months;

nominations made by family

nominations made by family members are not accepted, according to the award website. Prince William of Wales and Prince Harry, the Duke of Sussex, delivered recorded video messages to the recipients in memory of their mother. Congratulating the recipients who overcame many challenges to get here, William said the award recognises the power of

award recognises the power of people to inspire change. "Every single young person we are celebrating today has been on their unique journey driven by their own processions

driven by their own passions, perspectives and life experiences. "What unites them is their courage, compassion and dedi-cation to improving the lives of others." others.
